A Typical Hudson District School - c. 1810 (Each district built similar buildings)

- 1. Each building varied in size according to the number of pupils in the district.
- 2. The width of the school was nearly equal to the length.
- 3. Each building had a gable style roof.
- 4. The entrance was at the middle of the front of The building.
- 5. The teacher's platform and desk was on the the other side directly opposite the entrance.
- 6. a. The seats and desks were made of heavy,

hard pine plank and placed on the two sides of the room at the right and left of the entrance.

- b. The larger were intended for the older pupils.
- 7. Floor in the center was for recitation and other purposes.
- 8. Boys were given the seats on one side of the house and girls the other side.
